SSA-UoG, TUAAG AND FUSSAG EMBARK ON INDEFINITE STRIKE OVER GOVERNMENT'S CONTINUED BREACH OF AGREEMENT.

Our brothers and sisters of the media, esteemed members of our great association, ladies and gentlemen, good morning and thank you for responding to our invitation.

The leadership of the Senior Staff Association, Universities of Ghana (SSA-UoG), the Technical University Administrators Association of Ghana (TUAAG) and the Federation of Universities Senior Staff Association of Ghana (FUSSAG) announce, with deep regret but unwavering resolve, our decision to embark on an **indefinite strike action** effective today, 21 May, 2025. This difficult decision comes after countless engagements and goodwill efforts extended to the government, which have unfortunately been met with persistent inaction, neglect, and a blatant failure to honour the terms of a duly signed agreement six months ago.

Despite numerous dialogues, reminders, and extended timelines, the government has continuously reneged on its commitments, thereby undermining the trust and cooperation that should exist between both parties. The signed agreement was not merely a symbolic gesture—it was a binding contract, born out of mutual consensus and aimed at ensuring improved conditions, fair treatment, and a sustainable future for all stakeholders.


We wish to make it categorically clear: **this strike is not an act of defiance, but a last-resort response to an entrenched culture of broken promises.** It is our responsibility to stand firm in defence of our rights, and to uphold the integrity of agreements meant to safeguard the welfare of our members and the public interest at large.

We understand the potential inconvenience this action may cause, and we do not take that lightly. However, we must emphasize that **the burden of this disruption lies squarely with the government's consistent breach of trust and failure to act in good faith.**

We call on all media houses, civil society organizations, and the general public to stand in solidarity with us as we take this principled stand. Let this strike serve as a clear message: **agreements must be respected, and commitments must be honoured.**

We remain resolved and nothing will move us to work until the government honours it's part of the agreement. Until then, **our strike action will continue indefinitely.**


